

Dr. Broderick Leaks serves on the USC faculty as an Assistant Professor of Clinical Pediatrics. Broderick is a licensed clinical psychologist and is currently the Assistant Director/Training Director at USC's Engemann Student Health Center Student Counseling Services. Broderick primarily provides psychotherapy to the student population at USC, in addition to providing training and supervision to doctoral psychology trainees. With the trainees, he facilitates a weekly Diversity Dialogues seminar that aims to create a space for the trainees to explore their own cultural identity and its impact on their clinical work. Broderick also teaches a freshman seminar course, Foundations at Self, at USC that explores identity development, leadership, and cultural analysis with an emphasis on the African American male experience. In addition, he was the former Student Counseling Services' liaison for the Center for Black Cultural and Student Affairs (CBCSA) at USC and previously served as a liaison and supervisor for the USC Asian Pacific American Student Services (APASS) Peer Mentor Program.

Broderick received his BA in Psychology from Baylor University, a MA in Theology from Fuller Theological Seminary, and a MA and PhD in Clinical Psychology from Fuller Theological Seminary's Graduate School of Psychology.
