There are two steps to apply for Somerville Place:

- 1. Complete the University's on-line Housing application at <a href="http://housing.usc.edu">http://housing.usc.edu</a>. On your Housing application, mark the building code as "FLT" and the Special Interest Program code as "SMVR."
- 2. Complete the Supplemental on-line application at www.usc.edu/cbcsa by the *priority* deadline: May 1, 2015, however will continue taking applications until the final deadline Friday, June 12, 2015.

In a collaborative effort with the Undergraduate Office of Admission and the Center for Black Cultural and Student Affairs, we have set aside the following dates for you to stay on Somerville Place and shadow a current Somerville Place resident to classes before or after your USC Explore session on the following days:

We highly recommend that you come on one of the above dates if you would like to stay on Somerville Place for an overnight visit and attend classes the following day.
